In you, Good Shepherd we lack nothing. To you we confess:


We have closed our hands to those in need. We have closed our hearts to the hurting and hopeless. We have closed off our love and lives to our neighbors.

Prayer

Let us pray.

O Lord Jesus Christ, you are the Good Shepherd who laid down your life for the sheep. Lead us now to the still waters of your life-giving Word that we may abide in your Father's house forevermore; for you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

First Reading: 1John 4:1-6

¹Dear friends, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God, because many false prophets have gone out into the world. ²This is how you can recognize the Spirit of God: Every spirit that acknowledges that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God, ³but every spirit that does not acknowledge Jesus is not from God. This is the spirit of the antichrist, which you have heard is coming and even now is already in the world.

⁴You, dear children, are from God and have overcome them, because the one who is in you is greater than the one who is in the world. ⁵They are from the world and therefore speak from the viewpoint of the world, and the world listens to them. ⁶We are from God, and whoever knows God listens to us; but whoever is not from God does not listen to us. This is how we recognize the Spirit of truth and the spirit of falsehood.

Gospel: John 10:11-18

¹¹"I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. ¹²The hired hand is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep. So when he sees the wolf coming, he abandons the sheep and runs away. Then the wolf attacks the flock and scatters it. ¹³The man runs away because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep.

¹⁴"I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me— ¹⁵just as the Father knows me and I know the Father—and I lay down my life for the sheep. ¹⁶I have other sheep that are not of this sheep pen. I must bring them also. They too will listen to my voice, and there shall be one flock and one shepherd. ¹⁷The reason my Father loves me is that I lay down my life—only to take it up again. ¹⁸No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have authority to lay it down and authority to take it up again. This command I received from my Father."

Message: What's so good about the Good Shepherd? Based on John 10:11-18

We Declare Our Faith: Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation, he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate. He suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who in unity with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Words of Institution







Some Helpful information about how we practice Communion at Peace...

We practice member communion. The historic church has practiced Communion in this way for 19 centuries. Rest assured, this practice is not intended to exclude people in any way, as though we are a special club. Rather, it is simply a loving way to ensure that you fully understand what Communion is. In that way, when you take it you can avoid any harm and fully appreciate its blessings.

Before our members receive Communion we ask that they can answer "yes" to all the following questions about Communion:

- 1. Do you confess your sins and seek to turn away from them?
- 2. Do you recognize that Jesus' sacrifice on the cross is the only way sins are forgiven?
- 3. Do you recognize that in Communion you receive Jesus' true body and true blood along with the bread and wine?
- 4. Do you believe the Bible is God's inspired Word and does not just contain some truths of God?
- 5. Do you believe what Peace Lutheran Church teaches and confesses, which is based on God's inspired Word?

How did you answer?

If you're unsure, that's perfectly fine. That's why we'd like to help you learn more. Please speak with Pastor Thiel and he'd be happy to answer any questions you have.
